THE PROGRAM

The BACHELOR'S IN SPECIAL EDUCATION (EXCEPTIONAL STUDENT EDUCATION) is a hybrid (online and face-to-face classes) degree that is designed to prepare professionals to teach individuals with learning and behavioral disabilities. Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to apply for a Florida teaching certificate in Exceptional Student Education (ESE) with an Endorsement in Teaching English as a Second language (TESOL) and Reading. Degree completers who pass the State required certification exams are eligible to teach in K-12 classrooms for students with learning disabilities, intellectual disability, emotional/behavioral disorders, and physical impairments, as well as in general education classes.

APPLICANTS

Applicants must first apply to FAU as a First year/freshman (applying immediately after high school) or transfer student (already earned 12 or more college credits after graduation; earned an Associates degree, or seeking a 2nd Bachelor's).
