- Decisions for Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Appeals are normally made within 3 weeks of submission.
- Students are responsible for all financial obligations made to the University, regardless of whether this appeal is approved or denied.

NOTE: The **Time Frame** represents the maximum number of attempted credits (combined institutional and transfer) for which a student is eligible to receive financial aid. For each student, the Time Frame maximum is computed individually according to the following formula: (*Program Length minus Transfer Credits*) x 150%.

- Students will NOT be eligible to receive financial aid for credits over the Time Frame maximum.
- NO additional allowances will be made for students who change majors or have excessive transfer credits.

YOU MUST SUBMIT THIS FORM ALONG WITH THE FOLLOWING:

- A detailed **Student Statement of Circumstances** explaining the circumstances that lead to you being unable to complete the program of study within the maximum timeframe.
 (A typed statement can be attached to this form. See Page 2 for more details.)
- An unofficial copy of an updated academic transcript.
 (Can be accessed online from the "Student Records" tab on MyFAU Self-Service.)

Page 3 of this form must be completed by an academic advisor from a college in your degree to be considered.

Completion by your academic advisor can take 2-4 weeks. Academic advisors will commonly require students to make an appointment 2-4 weeks in advance to meet to complete this form.
