VI. Community/State College Sub-Committee – Discussion

USF Charge as Follows:

"...the Graduate Council explore the potential impact of Florida state colleges who are now offering baccalaureate degrees on our graduate programs.identifying opportunities and threats to FAU's graduate programs and recommendations for how to maximize the benefits to FAU through a proactive approach or process to address this opportunity."

Sub - Committee members: Susan Fulks, David Newman, Allen Smith and Dr. Deborah Floyd

Discussion took place on what are any plans the UGC should have for incoming students with a bachelor degree from a four year state college. Concerns included grade inflation, need for a writing sample. The council would like to see data on how these students are doing at FAU. Susan Fulks hopes to have a report in the near future. It was decided that the sub - committee should still meet. Once the data is in it was suggested that the Provost be included in the discussion.

Governance Document – Floyd suggested that all colleges review their college document to see if it still works for them. The Graduate College staff may have updates on this.

Rosson – Asked the council to consider the issue of a dissenting vote on a defense committee and the issue of an external member casting a dissenting vote. Rosson believes this should be program specific. Every college should have a dissertation/thesis policy. The council should make a motion that colleges have a written rule for PhD/Masters dissenting votes. The policy should be approved by the Graduate Faculty of the college and it should then come to the UGC.

Miller motioned and Robison seconded the question to ask the colleges what their policy was. This question will be asked by the council members to their respective colleges. All council members were in favor of this.

Rosson would like to see a policy from each college by the end of the semester.

VII. Other – Governance Document

Additional discussion of some aspects of the original Graduate Governance Document took place. Rosson commented that some desired rules by the different colleges can be accomplished without changes to the document.
