## **Bachelor of Public Safety Administration (BPSA) to Master of Nonprofit Management (MNM)**

The BPSA/MNM combined degree program enables outstanding students to graduate with both a Bachelor of Public Safety Administration and a Master of Nonprofit Management in as little as five years. The program is 153 credits. Students complete 120 credits for the undergraduate degree and 33 credits for the graduate degree. Students complete the undergraduate degree first, taking no more than 12 credits of graduate coursework during their senior year, which are then used to satisfy requirements for both degrees. Prospective students must formally apply to this program and meet all admission requirements, including a GPA of 3.25 on a 4.0 scale.
